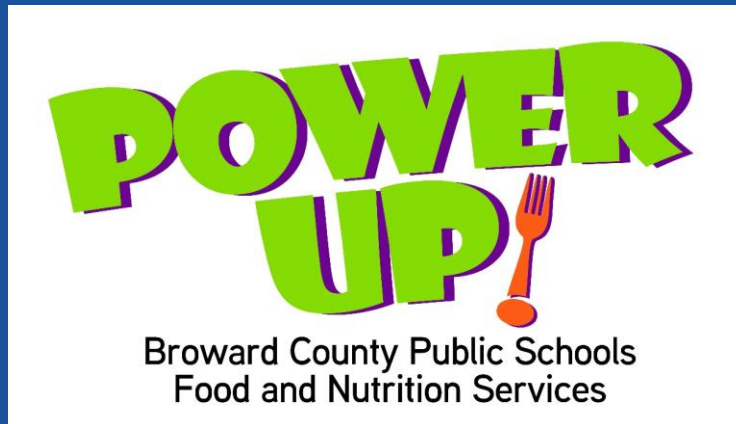

Point of Sale for Special Diet Identification

- Broward County Public Schools Food and Nutrition Services area of best practice is the use of the point of sale (POS) for identification of special dietary needs in schools during Summer Feeding. Utilizing the POS functions to identify students with allergies or other special dietary needs to prioritize safety and ensure an appropriate, nutritious meal.
 - Identification at the POS promotes safety and reduces the risk of an adverse medical event resulting from a known special dietary need
 - Handheld scanners allow for physical distancing of children and staff to reduce risk while easily identifying each child

Point of Sale for Special Diet Identification

TACTICS / IMPLEMENTATION

- Hands-free identification utilizing hand scanners
- Identifying known special dietary needs at the POS with Alerts to notify staff
- Allowance for staff to review menu items to make certain no hazardous foods are given that could result in an adverse medical event

IMPACT / SUCCESSES

- Prioritizing safety
- Reducing instances of adverse medical events
- Increasing participation for children with special dietary needs
- Promoting a culture of trust
