



Recently USFA Member Lora Gilbert, Senior Director with Orange County Public Schools and USFA staff member Jeremy West, Director of Partnerships & Member Engagement presented a webinar to members of the National Association of Pupil Transportation. NAPT is an international trade association with members all across North America & in Australia.



The presentation title was: "Partnerships Against Hunger: School Buses Delivering School Meals and highlighted the successful partnerships between district transportation and nutrition to bring meals to students during the pandemic and ideas for continued collaboration.

Mr. O'Brien has worked for 30 years to improve school meals for the 1.1 million New York City students though out the city. He has a broad understanding of the complexities involved in delivering a quality service to students. Stephen has overseen several changes and transformed school meals and cafeterias making them a model for districts across the country including using more locally sourced foods, cutting out ingredients of concern, bringing salad bars to all kitchens, implementing the service of whote grains, converting from polystyrene to compostable plates and utensils in cafeterias, and getting students encased in the meal service.

Mr. O'Brien has been honored for his work and participates in conferences and events that educate communities about school meals, nutrition education programming, sustainability, and other model practices for engaging and educating communities about School Meals. He is a key leader within the Urban School Food Aliliance, serving as a founding member and actively supports best practice sharing, policy positions and large-scale market change to improve the quality of meals offered nationally.

Mr. O'Brien holds an A.O.S in Culinary Arts, a B.S. in Food Service Management with a minor in Secondary Education from Johnson & Wales University, ECornell Certificate in Plant-Based

Once schools closed in March 2020, due to COVID, School Food Service remained focused on our purpose "To provide Nutritious Meals and Promote Healthful Living" by shifting meal service models, working with community partners, and developing new accountability measures. Within one week of school closing, School Food Service staff were passing out meals at grab-and-go locations at schools across the District. In total, our School Lunch Heroes served over 4.5 million meals from school closure through June 30, 2020. During school closing, and into the summer, School Food Service remained up- to-date on national and state changes in school nutrition programs and nimble in making required changes. New procedures and technology solutions were developed to support our children and families to the highest extent possible.



These issues are nothing new, but the pandemic shed a light on them by forcing suppliers to make choices about which clients they could continue to serve. "I really think that the pandemic has shown that we are not good to do business with," Wilson said.

New rules that allow for more flexibility in the way schools plan meals and purchase food would empower schools to be more "proactive instead of reactive to whatever is happening around us," Benavidez said.

School cafeterias are looking for workers, too

"A crisis point"

"The labor shortage has become really quite a crisis point for many of us in school nutrition, particularly in these large urban districts," said Katie Wilson, executive director of the Urban School Food Alliance, a group that represents food service professionals in the nation's largest school districts. "Many of our districts are looking for [200] to 300 employees in their school nutrition programs alone."

And she said the labor shortage doesn't end at the cafeteria door.

"The distributors, the manufacturers, are also having labor problems. There's not enough people working in warehouses, there's not enough truck drivers. We've heard from a couple of the distributors that for every 10 trucks, they can only send one out," Wilson said.

Schools Transform Into 'Relief' Kitchens, but Federal Aid Fails to Keep Up

Many school cafeterias are now operating more like community soup kitchens, even though the federal school meals program won't reimburse districts for meals served to struggling adults.



California wants to feed students' families. The USDA says no. Some states are doing it anyway.

Even with record unemployment and skyrocketing food insecurity, USDA says it lacks the authority to reimburse school districts for adult meals through the summer meals program.
